

2017 was a busy year that presented plenty of new challenges. I participated in 10 exhibitions, with my sculpture and painting work appearing in juried, group, and solo shows across Ohio and Iowa. My bronze sculpture *Portrait of the Artist's Father* garnered an honorable mention at the Gateway Arts Council's Spring Arts Event in Sidney, Ohio.

Throughout the summer I joined Central Ohio Plein Air to paint outdoors at various locations around the state. I joined Ohio Portrait Painters for a few sessions of painting from a clothed model. I continued working in bronze sculpture at the Columbus Cultural Arts Center.


For the second year in a row I was selected to participate in the Columbus Open Studio & Stage tour. My studio was opened to the public and visitors were given a glimpse into my artistic process. I was one of 50 artists working at 32 separate sites. The program was again made possible by the hard work and dedication of community builders and cross-

discipline artists Stephanie Rond, Catherine Bell Smith, Amy Leibrand, and Lisa McLymont. The program was built in partnership with the *Art Makes Columbus* | *Columbus Makes Art* initiative and the Greater Columbus Arts Council.

In the late summer, I again traveled to Lake Erie for a painting retreat with the members of Central Ohio Plein Air. I completed four paintings in a three-day period, participated in an art show and sale, and enjoyed the pastoral landscape of Vermilion, Ohio.

I dedicated the duration of the year to refining one work of bronze sculpture which is currently being prepared to be cast. The final piece will be the stylized form of a ring of fire – intended as a riff on the traditional circus act, and inspired by automotive painting.

Opportunities to engage with my work in 2018 have already begun. Two exhibitions have been scheduled in the coming months, with a few more on the horizon.








Homestead Park Pavilion, by Katherine N. Crowley, oil on canvas panel, 8"x 10", 2017.











{ring of fire, bronze sculpture in progress}

I spent the better part of the year designing and sculpting a ring of fire concept. The piece is large in size and fairly light weight. However, the complex system of gates and vents needed to cast it in a single pour doubles its size. The final shape demands a large and very heavy mold, which takes three men and a woman to move from studio, to furnace, to kiln, to foundry. Once complete, the *Ring of Fire* will be mounted on an iron rod, and ready for the circus. I thank Matthew Anderle, Ric Stewart, Ken Goodson, and Gavin Bruce for their artistic guidance and physical assistance in bringing this work to life.






