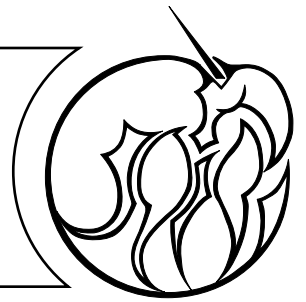


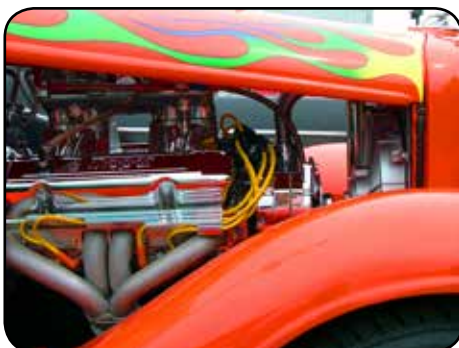
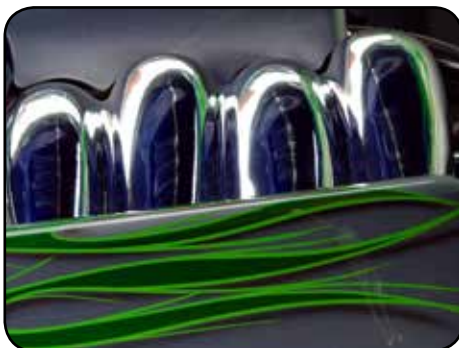

George's Beechwold Diner in the Clintonville neighborhood of Columbus, Ohio serves burgers and fries, gyros and reubens, cinnamon rolls and pies, and breakfast all day. As long-time customers, my family and I can frequently be found sipping coffee and iced tea at the counter and occasionally meeting our neighbors at a booth. The diner is decorated in traditional fashion: with photographs of Marilyn Monroe and Elvis Presley, Ohio State memorabilia, historic Clintonville scenes, a smattering of Albanian flags, and lots of car posters. Gjergji Cela is a car guy. And he's the owner.

After several years of slinging hash on Indianola Avenue, Mr. Cela decided to expand the business. He opened George's Linworth Diner on West Dublin-Granville Road earlier this spring. To help out with the decorations, and to get the exposure so coveted by us visual artists, selections from my *Hot Rod* series are on display at both locations. Each framed photo includes a QR code.
