After visiting a retrospective exhibit about photographer Sally Mann, I have recently become more interested in photography. In the spring I visited walked around my neighborhood, including Glen Echo Ravine, and photographed blossoming flowers graffiti under a few different bridges. I visited Rock Mill in Lancaster, Ohio and painted and photographed the mill and covered bridge. Constructed in 1824, the grist mill was recently restored to working order and stands 90 feet above the gorge of Hocking River Falls.

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Around the Statehouse: I spent a beautiful Saturday afternoon wandering the Ohio Statehouse grounds with my family. We visited each of the monuments and the Civil War era cannons at each corner of the property. We had come from a performance of "Hello Dolly" at the Ohio Theater, which is celebrating its 50th anniversary as part of CAPA, the organization that saved it from the wrecking ball in the 1970s.

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My family and I attended "The Mikado" at the Southern Theater, a space that is best described as a lovely jewel box. Following a performance of "Rent" at the recently restored Palace Theater (which is modeled after the Palace of Versailles) we stopped into the Hotel Leveque, which was also recently restored and modernized to celebrate its art deco heritage.

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Miscellaneous photos of peanut shoppes in both Columbus and Akron, Ohio; bottles of acrylic paint from a bridal shower painting party in Powell; lunch at The Lockview Tavern in Akron; dinner at The Grass Skirt in Columbus, antique fishing lures; and a mural of a bluejay.

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"Nick Cave Feat. Akron" at the Akron Art Museum: Nick Cave creates a fantastical dreamland of color, sound, movement, and texture that claims a celebratory identity in an increasingly troubled world. By turning a collection of flea market treasures into whimsical parade costumes, his "Soundsuits" confront fear and prejudice with exuberant joy. His static sculptural constructions present a world of beauty created through a shameful past. His video installation, a meditation on both psychology and dance movement, provides a sample of his performance-based work that welcomes communities to join together and celebrate their common experiences.

Stan Hywet Hall and Gardens, Akron, Ohio: In 1898, brothers F.A. and C.W. Seiberling founded The Goodyear Tire & Rubber Company. Named for Charles Goodyear who discovered the process for vulcanizing rubber, the company earned Akron the reputation as the "Rubber Capital of the World." F.A. and his wife Gertrude constructed Stan Hywet as one of the finest examples of the American Country Estate for their family to gather and grow. The collections and furnishings in the Manor House are all original to the Estate.
