






One positive outcome from COVID-19 stay-at-home orders has been the increase in online programming for everything from software tutorials to ghost and vampire tours. Over the past year, I have taken advantage of a number of these offerings. Here is a survey of what's out there.


{adobe max}

This year's creativity conference was presented entirely online, and for free. My Valentine's Day illustration and St. Patrick's Day animated gif were created using Adobe Fresco Adobe Photoshop, and Adobe After Effects. Virtual labs were presented by Sarah Beth Morgan and Nol Honing.









{autodesk university}

This year's design and construction conference was presented entirely online, and for free.

I focused my attention on classes addressing Autodesk Fusion, an industrial design software that can be used to design functional objects that can later be 3D printed as prototypes or for actual use. And what's the first thing I designed using Autodesk Fusion? A replacement art deco style toaster handle.

In addition to attending classes, I had the privilege of being featured in a presentation about Autodesk Forge and how the company I work for leverages the technology to streamline data analysis and project workflows. I presented alongside colleague (and husband) Matthew Anderle, and colleague Russ Dalton.

A few months before the conference was set to go live, we began working with Autodesk to write the script. A production company shipped us media kits that included iPads, microphones, ear buds, and lighting. We set everything up ourselves and took live direction from the media team located in California. After "principal photography" was complete, we had the opportunity to review and approve the final video which was integrated into a larger presentation.











{riffe center virtual tours}

The Riffe Center Gallery began offering guided tours of their exhibits through their website and through Facebook Live. I attended the Facebook Live presentation along with about 40 other people while on my lunch break one afternoon. The guide explained the selected works by each artist and how the collective artwork fits the theme of community engagement. A virtual tour is available through April 10th.



CONVERSATIONS & COFFEE

{cultural arts center}

The Columbus Cultural Arts Center, a historic building that hosts exhibits and offers classes to adults in a variety of media. It had closed in March, re-opened in June, and closed again in the fall as concerns about the spread of the virus fluxuated. Conversations & Coffee is the city's longest-running series of artist talks where attendees have the chance to gain key insight people from different corners of the art world. In October the CAC moved their Conversations & Coffee program online in October of 2020 and offers recordings of previous presentations.

{stanford arts}

"Artists on the Future", the Komal Shah and Gaurav Garg Artist Conversation Series pairs world-famous artists with cultural thought leaders to talk about issues vital to our society. In November, the university hosted a discussion between acclaimed painter Njideka Akunyili Crosby and Thelma Golden, the Director and Chief Curator of the Studio Museum in Harlem and a fierce advocate for diversity and equity in the art world. The conversation was moderated by Matthew Tiews, Stanford's interim senior associate vice president for the arts.





{trio 212}

Trio 212 is a New York City based reed trio whose performance opportunities became limited when theaters had to close their doors. Clarinetist Dr. Ian Tyson and I are longtime friends who met in the Miami University Marching Band. Together with bassoonist Josh Hodge and oboist Mark Sophia, Trio 212 began offering live concerts through GroupMuse and Facebook Live from Mr. Hodge's apartment. The group found a new way to reach audiences and plan to continue offering online concerts once in-person performances resume.

{fright night nola}

Fright Night NOLA has to be one of the most interesting online presentation opportunities I've come across. When COVID-19 cancelled all ghost and vampire tours in New Orleans, a group of tour guides formed an alliance to bring live virtual tours of the French Quarter to out-of-towners. Cedric, a psychic / energy vampire and paranormal investigator; Kamile, a VooDoo practitioner; TourGuide Scott; and Taylor share historic and true crime stories through Facebook Live. The krewe expanded their stomping grounds to swamps, city parks, and cemeteries to bring their audience more stories from the shadows.

This year I am serving as President of the Worthington Area Art League. This season all League business is being managed virtually and as a result, new opportunities are being offered. We began holding our monthly meetings using Zoom where each month a guest speaker gives a presentation. Recordings of the presentations are available on our website.
