

For 25 years, the Wexner Center for the Arts has hosted a short film series called *Ohio Shorts*. Showcasing Ohio's vibrant and diverse filmmaking culture, *Ohio Shorts* was curated by Cincinnati-based artist and Ohio Shorts alumna Prentiss Haney, who also selected the recipient of the \$500 Jury Award. The program includes 20 works that were selected out of 122 submissions from around the state.

Being a part of Ohio Shorts was pivotal in my journey and development as an artist. It was one of the first times I saw my artistry amplified and celebrated publicly. Ohio Shorts creates space for artists to be celebrated for who they are and for the important stories they need to tell. This year's entries are no exception. I curated a show that reflected the energy and themes of 2020: isolation, connection, caring for one another, and social uprising. My creative audacity grew because of Ohio Shorts. I hope this event will inspire these artists to continue to reflect the times and tell powerful stories.

This year *Ohio Shorts* was made available to stream online. I watched each film and posted a brief synopsis / reaction to each on my Twitter page. The following pages display a still from each film accompanied by my Tweets.

I am personally acquainted with two of the entrants and was impressed by the diversity of approaches to similar themes. We're Home Alone was submitted by a friend's two daughters who have been producing a series of stop-motion animations using their dolls and toys. As a Matter of Black is a documentary by an acquaintance Donte Woods-Spikes that investigates different perspectives on social justice.

Wilderness Days by Jason Younkman impressed me the most: a walking tour of New York City that is a compilation of audio-visual stimuli.



Wilderness Days

"Wilderness Days" presents a frenetic tour of NYC consumed by texture, graffiti messages & constant police sirens. Street art, chalk writing & posters mix with glimpses of trees. Torn paper moves across the screen like waves on the seashore.

With "Wilderness Days" Younkman gives a true sense of the sights & sounds of NYC from pedestrian level, whether its a 1st visit or a jaded day-in-the-life. The pedestrian encounters homeless, commuters & rioters & returns home to a pulsing apt.



Spring Outbreak

"Spring Outbreak" is a slow pan around a digital classroom. Audio documents the trajectory of COVID-19 from Mar-Aug 2020, when schools were closed. The empty 3D animated classroom presents a metaphor for the digital classrooms that followed.

Ironically titled, "The Roaring 20s" chronicles 2 high school students lives during COVID-19 quarantine & their longing to return to their old lives. Phone conversations & online meetings mix with memories.

"#FASHION2020" is a day-in-the-life view of a sophisticated young woman living within the confines of the COVID-19 pandemic. Working from home, cooking at home & talking to Mom on the phone culminate in our heroine answering the door unprepared.



Bleeding on the Blank Page

"Sona VS" is a deconstructivist cartoon about a girl who is torn over her need to capture a bird. It has a lot of nice Tex Avery style elements. I can't help but think there is deeper meaning in the story; but more context is needed.



"We're Home Alone!"

"We're Home Alone!" is a stop-motion/live action hybrid about 2 dolls who have the run of the house while their "parents" are away. Frame by frame they eat crackers, jump on the sofa, draw pictures & sneak back into bed.

"Family Tree" is a performance art piece using a variety of camera techniques and some layering of imagery. The theme addresses compounding loss in the context of home as a framework. The film is driven by music, choreography, costume & props.

"love." is a compilation of 50 interviews, conducted in multiple languages. Each speaker is asked what love means to them. Typography is interspersed with photos, & video clips. 2 children act out simple acts of kindness to illustrate the audio.



Uncle Zsiga

"Uncle Zsiga" is a pensive glimpse at a father-daughter relationship in the face of alcoholism & abuse. A Hungarian father attempts to reconcile with his daughter on her birthday. The music is thoughtful, the depth-of field-deliberate & effective.



Slushie Ben Evory, 2019, 14:26 mins. Dayton, OH | Adult Division

"Slushie" is reminiscent of Napoleon Dynomite in its awkward view of a rural Christian band hoping to hit the big time in LA. Themes of "questioning" (religious beliefs, sexuality, truth) underlie the primary narrative.



Push Forward

"Push Forward" is a nicely constructed story of a young man in search of his roots. In trying to fill a void in his own life, he develops a program to fulfill the needs of others while reconnecting with his family. The photography enhances the story.



Caregiving

"Caregiving" is a brief look at a man caring for his mother. The film highlights the value of small moments during the daily routine & the reward the man feels in learning about his mother on a more intimate level.

"Sound Spring Seq. #6: The School & The Home", a thoughtful depiction of a reading of an interview by #JalynRoe by a 2 young residents of Yellow Springs. Rooms & clay illustrates the story. The closing scene brings to mind.

"Áine" is a portrait of a #DownsSyndrome through a mother's eyes. It is a lover letter. "To me, having a child with Downs Syndrome means going farther than you knew you could... she is on her own singular path".

"J20" This piece asks the viewer to focus on the audio. A single scene moves slowly & shakily toward the Ohio Statehouse which outfit with barriers & guarded by security. The audio is a compilation of chants & protests.

"As a Matter of Black" is a peaceful look at peaceful protest & art activism. The film documents art campaigns, marches & demonstrations in Columbus Ohio in response to police involved killings of black citizens.

"Standing in the Blink of a Night: For Casey Goodson Jr." A documentary of the community's response to the killing of Casey Goodson Jr at the hands of law enforcement. The film ends with a plea for 2nd Amendment rights by attorney Sean L. Walton.
