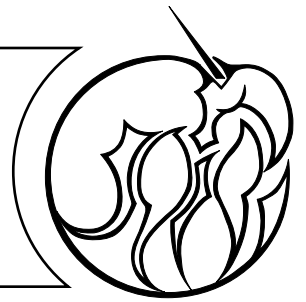

{endless summer}

The Ruby-Throated Hummingbird is the most common hummingbird in Ohio. Invite them to spend the summer in your backyard by keeping your garden in continuous bloom. Foxglove beardtongue, wild columbine, jewelweed, and wild bergamot provide food all season long.

This piece was inspired by an article in Wild Ohio magazine discussing garden flowers that support hummingbirds.

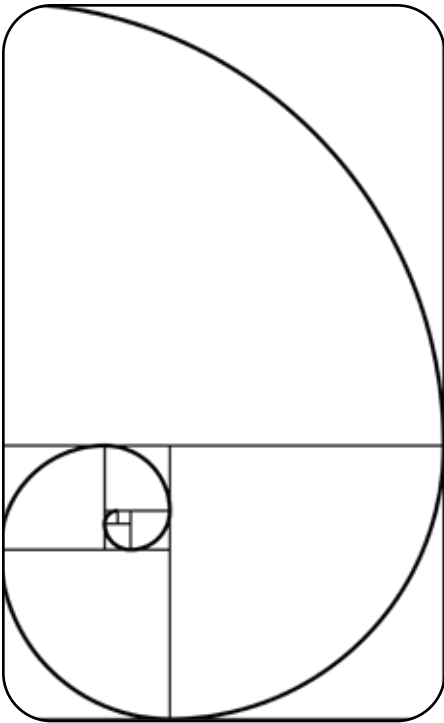
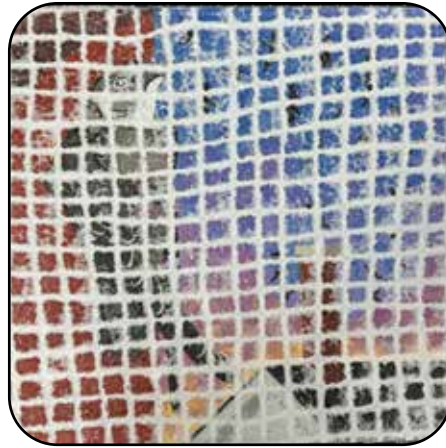


{good nighthawk}

Easily camouflaged by their gravel nesting grounds, the Common Nighthawk shows his true colors at dusk as he hunts flying insects. Listed as a "Common Bird in Steep Decline", the Nighthawk suffers food shortage due to pesticide use. Organic farming and habitat restoration can support their population.

For this painting, I took a "Magic Eye" approach to hiding the bird in plain sight.

{flight pattern: the chimney swift}

Roosting and nesting in abandoned chimneys, the Chimney Swift has adapted well to urban environments. However, they are one of two species in Columbus designated as Vulnerable in the Second Ohio All-Bird Conservation Plan. Green roofs and artificial chimneys are encouraged to support their population.

I experimented with the Fibonacci (Golden Ratio) spiral to inform the flight pattern of the chimney swifts in the background.

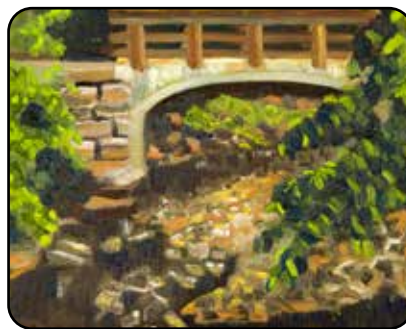
